

Educational Opportunities For Care Givers

The MORC Training Department has entered into two exciting educational partnerships to expand opportunities for care givers, to improve their personal and professional potential, and to enhance the image of the care giving role.

High School Diploma Credit through MORC Training and Hazel Park Adult and Alternative Education

In partnership with MORC, Hazel Park Adult and Alternative Education is offering special high school completion and GED preparation courses. Students attending MORC training classes can now also enroll at Hazel Park Adult and Alternative Education and earn credit for MORC training.

Students can now earn credit toward a high school diploma through the MORC Entry-Level Care Giver Training course and can then continue to work toward a diploma or GED through Hazel Park Adult and Alternative Education.

Students under the age of 20 can work toward their high school diploma, and students over the age of 20 can work toward their GED at no cost, if they qualify. Students can use online learning programs to work from school or from an off-site location, such as home. All classes are offered through Hazel Park Schools.

Only designated Entry-Level Care Giver Training classes at the MORC Auburn Hills Office training site qualify for this program.

The MORC/OCC Partnership

MORC and Oakland Community College (OCC) have come together through a unique partnership to provide opportunities for furthering both professional and academic education. Anyone who has successfully completed the MORC Entry-Level Care Giver Training course will be eligible. You have up to two years following completion of training to activate the college credits.

The partnership provides:

- A seamless transition from MORC training to OCC college courses.
- The transfer of four college credits for the MORC Entry-Level Care Giver Training.
- A pathway to apprenticeship, OCC Certificate of Achievement, and an Associates Degree.
